At the communion, God welcomes all to the heavenly banquet. The Episcopal Church offers the sacraments to anyone baptized in any denomination who, through prayer and thoughtful consideration, desires them. Please come to the communion rail to receive the bread whether you are an Episcopalian or not, or to receive a blessing.

When coming to the rail for communion, please kneel or stand at the rail from right to left until the rail is full. You may receive the wafer, receive the wine after consuming the wafer (no indicting) or may ask for a blessing. Please let the priest know if you need gluten free.

The priest, Debbie, is available after the service to answer any questions you might have. Please let her know your thoughts about today's service.


The First Lesson

Acts 11:1-18

Now the apostles and the believers who were in Judea heard that the Gentiles had also accepted the word of God. So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcised believers criticized him, saying, "Why did you go to uncircumcised men and eat with them?" Then Peter began to explain it to them, step by step, saying, "I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision. There was something like a large sheet coming down from heaven, being lowered by its four corners; and it came close to me. As I looked at it closely I saw fourfooted animals, beasts of prey, reptiles, and birds of the air. I also heard a voice saying to me, 'Get up, Peter; kill and eat.' But I replied, By no means, Lord; for nothing profane or unclean has ever entered my mouth.' But a second time the voice answered from heaven, 'What God has made clean, you must not call profane.' This happened three times; then everything was pulled up again to heaven. At that very moment three men, sent to me from Caesarea, arrived at the house where we were. The Spirit told me to go with them and not to make a distinction between them and us. These six brothers also

accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. He told us how he had seen the angel standing in his house and saying, `Send to Joppa and bring Simon, who is called Peter; he will give you a message by which you and your entire household will be saved.' And as I began to speak, the Holy Spirit fell upon them just as it had upon us at the beginning. And I remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said, `John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' If then God gave them the same gift that he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I that I could hinder God?" When they heard this, they were silenced. And they praised God, saying, "Then God has given even to the Gentiles the repentance that leads to life."

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A Message from the Senior Warden

Dear Grace Church,

Happy Eastertide! Now that Holy Week and Easter have passed, we naturally turn to the next big event in the life of Grace Church: Debbie's last weeks with us as our Rector. I want to give you a brief update of where we are in the process and what is coming.

Debbie's last Sunday with us will be June 22, and there is a celebratory service planned (information about that event will be announced separately).

The process of calling a new Rector is a long one, and we will walk through it with intention. In July, Grace Church as a whole will begin a period of congregational discernment. This time of self-study will likely occupy us through the rest of 2025. During this stage of the process, the Vestry will assemble a search committee, which will take an in-depth look at our history, identity, mission, and goals. The Vestry will consider how the search process will impact our budget and what financials will look like going forward. It's a process of discovering (and rediscovering) who we are and what we discern God's dreams for us to be. With that identity, we can begin to find a new Rector.

In January of 2026 (or thereabouts), the search committee will start receiving names of candidates and begin narrowing down the field. This may be the longest part of the process. When the search committee and Vestry all agree on a candidate, we will issue a call to that person and invite them to be our new Rector.

Through this entire process, we will continue to be Grace Church. We'll still be in community with one another and meet as we always do for services, Bible study, fellowship, silent films, cookie walks, and pancake dinners. We will have support from our diocese and transitional priests, and we will not be adrift at sea.

So, for now, we are still in a process of saying goodbye. I cannot overemphasize the importance of this time. Debbie's pastoral relationship with Grace Church is coming to an end, and now is our opportunity to express to her what having her as part of Grace has meant to each of us, to express our gratitude to her, and to wish her well. After June, our goodbyes will be over and our paths will diverge, so it is important to make the most of this time of farewell. More on how we can best do that will be announced later this month.
